The Sunday Forum — 9:45 –10:45. This week EFM Director, Karen Meridith will discuss "Oikos:Community in the Greco-Roman World." at the Sunday Forum on September 4, 2022. When we say, "We receive you into the household of God"; at an Episcopal baptism, we are echoing the Greco-Roman concept of oikos (household), the model for organizing early Christian communities. We will look at some common characteristics of households and other kinds of associations/communities in the Greco-Roman world, their place in the overall concept of the polis (the greater community), and how these classical concepts contribute to our present-day concept of the church (local and beyond the local) as a community.
