To ensure social distancing, please sit (with your family) near one of the small white flags. In accordance with new CDC guidance and Sewanee policy, masks are now optional outdoors.



The Nicene Creed







When Bread and Wine are ready for distribution, the Celebrant says The gifts of God for the people of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion. Be sure to maintain 6 feet of distance from anyone outside your household at all times. Extend your arms fully and cup your hands to receive the bread without touching. Gluten-free wafers are available; simply ask the priest. As you pass the table of chalices, you are invited to pick up one per household; please wait until returning to your seat to consume the Sacrament. Please return the chalice to one of the tables provided following the service.


