

Sunday Forum on Sept. 17, 9:45 -10:45 in Kennerly Hall: Sewanee English Professor Jennifer Michael will speak on "The Word beyond words: finding God in poetry." While poetic expressions of theology and spirituality go all the way back to Scripture, she notes that this discussion will focus on several contemporary poets who use poetry to communicate and sometimes to question their experience of the divine. Dr. Michael graduated from Sewanee, studied at Oxford on a Rhodes Scholarship, and then earned her PhD at Northwest University in British Romantic Poetry. Her first scholarly book focused on *Blake and the City* while her current project, Poetry at the Edge of Silence, draws on contemplative practice as a way to engage both with the environment and with language. She is also the author of two poetry chapbooks.
