The Sunday Forum – 9:45 –10:45, Kennerly Hall. This Sunday the Very Rev. Bruce McMillan and John Solomon present "Renewal of Community in Civic Life." John Solomon and the Very Rev. McMillan was born and raised in Jackson, Tennessee and graduated from the University of the South in 1976 with a B.A. in English. For eight years following graduation he worked in the banking business in Jackson and at age 23 was elected to the Madison County Commission, where he served there for six years until "I lost my mind in 1984," at which point he went to seminary in Austin, Texas. He served three parishes in his ordained life before retiring to Sewanee in 2020. He was elected to the Franklin County Commission in 2022 and also serves at the altars of Sherwood's Epiphany Episcopal Church, the St. Mary's Convent in Sewanee, and, on occasion, at St. Mark and St. Paul.

Solomon was raised in Argentina and then came to Sewanee for college (C'70), graduating as an economics major. He worked in commercial banking in St. Louis, reaching the po-
